




Celebrating A.S. Neill's Birthday at Summerhill-continued

It started with an idea to make a radio show, then someone said, "We could make a newspaper!" That was the spark!

We ran with the idea and six kids and two staff jumped on board and the bus hit the road ... where will it head to? Nobody can say for sure because there's always something new being created at Summerhill and natural energy on tap!

What to call the newspaper? Way back in history, about '45, the children were affectionately chanting, "Neill, Neill! Orange Peel! " and there evolved a periodical named "Orange Peel" *



This came up in discussions about a name and a suggestion popped out of the ether: we could call it "Apple Peel"! "Speak Now" was another and so the group, the editors, decided to amalgamate the two and get on with the first edition. It may morph again, but that's the name right now.

We aim to keep to keep publishing weekly as so much is happening!






Foreword to "All the Best, Neill" letters from Summerhill, edited by Jonathan Croall

Thinking of Neill and his writing leads me naturally to the everyday picture of him seated at his desk in the office. Writing was so much a part of his life that he spent many hours there. I think that anybody at all closely connected with him will remember the old office. It had a particular smell, a mixture of pencil peelings, pipe tobacco, paper, and ink.

We still have his desk and it smells exactly the same.

Sometimes I was allowed to arub through the drawers. They were full of odds and ends cigarette lighters. rubber bands, golf tees, pliers and the occasional Old photograph. I remember my delight when small on finding a picture of Neill age 3 with his mother.



One drawer held masses of typewriter ribbons – a job lot bought cheaply I suspect! Also Neill's treasures, an old Parker 51 which he bought in America and his Dunhill briar pipe. The rest of the office was full of cupboards and drawers. A Roneo with locking top drawer where the pocket money was kept also had filing drawers underneath, though I don't remember anything actually being filed.

Neill was frugal but not tidy and his office reflected this. Most of the cupboards were painted a revolting dusky pink, probably a few pots which needed using. There was a battered armchair by the gas fire and beside this two tins. One contained Yale locks, the other one keys. Also a plumber's bag full of bed springs. When anyone visited Neill for a chat he would sit and take the springs apart ready for bed mending sessions in the holidays, or try keys in the locks until he found one that fitted. The ceiling high bookshelf by the door contained psychological and educational books. Serious stuff withlong words and no pictures.


On the shelf by the window was Neill's wine making equipment. If you were lucky, a glass of elderberry wine might be in the offering. Quite strong, as I recall, and full of sediment but very nice.

In the early days a box by the fire held a knitted toy family made in the needlework class. They were mother, father, son and daughter, complete with penis, pubic hair and an unmentionable family name!

I think we were supposed to act out our hidden inhibitions with them but seem to remember playing rude games instead!

As well as being a busy writer Neill also read a great deal. He liked "good" books and crossword puzzles. He was always excited about his morning mail although in later years when it grew to "fan mail" proportions he did grumble a little. It vexed him that people expected a reply without enclosing stamps. But just as he could never pass a hitchhiker without offering a lift, so he religiously answered all his mail, even if it was only a few lines.

Reading through these letters which show Neill's warmth, wit and flair for writing, I feel it important that we remember not only himself, the man, but more importantly, what he stood for in education and childrearing. This was a man to whom the freedom, confidence. and happiness of children were of foremost importance. He was deeply committed to his ideas for free children and spent his life working for those beliefs. In 1983 - one hundred years after he was born his summerhill still leaves the rest of the world standing as far as education is concerned, let us hope that it does not take 100 years for the rest of the world to catch up!
